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


An online flash poll was conducted of GBTA members and non-members worldwide, including corporate travel managers and travel suppliers


- Fielding took place from July 6 through July 13, 2021
- An email invitation was sent to 16,037 travel professionals including current and inactive members of GBTA; a link to the survey was also included in GBTA's *Daily News Brief* sent to travel professionals worldwide
- In total, 618 companies responded to the poll
- Note: Some totals might not add to 100% because of rounding; each percentage is rounded to the nearest whole number






The State of Domestic Business Travel






% of companies that have canceled or suspended most or all <u>international</u> business travel











Q. When does your company expect to resume the following types of business trips specifically? (n=545-546)

How have bookings from corporate customers changed in the past week?




Almost Three-Quarters of Buyers Say Their Company's Travel Spend Increased in June

Are Employees Willing to Travel for Work?




Do Travel Managers think their company's employees are willing to travel?





Current status of company's office reopening plan





Many Respondents Expect Their Company Will Continue to Allow Flexibility Even After Offices Fully Reopen








Will your company require employees to receive a COVID-19 vaccine before they can...?




