































On the edge of the tiger heartland of the world – cocooned in Sal Forest, where the river flows gently by and shy deer peer through incredible eyelashes standing poised for flight – lies the first Hidden India camp – MAHAVAN

Named after the great forests of Central India, the setting for the fabled Jungle Book — Mahavan is a hideaway that offers an experience like no other.

With its own Solar power plant, a minimal footprint on the ground, committed to recycling, reusing, upcycling, with over a 350000 litres of surface water runoff stored in ponds created for the purpose, wildlife friendly fencing, electric vehicles, organic farming — all in 22 acres of rewilded land, Mahavan is proudly carbon negative and devoted to being sustainable and responsible in all it does.

Sharing the land with the tribal Baiga and Gond Communities

Working with them to preserve and document their indigenous knowledge, culture and art.













































