The Resort was created to offer visitors a unique vacation experience and the possibility to discover the beautiful region of Greece that lies in the northwest of the country.











Location of ARISTI MOUNTAIN RESORT + VILLAS



ARISTI in Europe ⇐








Zagori Region, Epirus, Greece




OUR COMMITMENT TO CULTURE & TRADITION

Only local materials, stone and wood decorate the inner and outer parts of the buildings. The staff of the Resort is comprised of locals. We use local products and cooperate with local companies to maintain a close relationship with the local community. We report monthly our environmental indices, train our staff regularly, and try to increase the awareness of our clients towards preserving the environmental integrity of the area. Committed to the conservation of the environment, we are proudly included in the 21 most environmentally friendly places in the world, according to National Geographic. 














The "Reappearances" project was a combination of a practical workshop and a participatory restoration of an old cobbled pathway, an important part of Aristi's "kalderimi" network, in Zagori Region. The main goal of the workshop was to involve the local community in the appreciation and management of its own cultural landscape and public heritage. Placing the focus on local stakeholders, the program was targeted at the people of Aristi: those who permanently reside in the village, as well as those who originate from Aristi and the broader area of Zagori but live in different places around Greece and abroad.

The restoration lasted four weeks, to construct a sixty-meterlong pathway, around sixty-five square meters of dry-stone walls, along with a small public fountain. During the project, local collective memories over the historical use of the pathway were rejuvenated.



The project was also framed with parallel activities, such as hiking along Voidomatis in the UNESCO global geopark of Vikos-Aoos, a cultural walk at the historic place where the Grambala Battle took place, a visit in the sacred forest of Ayia Paraskevi and documentary screening.







Part of the restored cobbled pathway (18



The Monastery of Panagia Spileotissa preservation




The Monastery of Panagia Spileotissa Preservation

The Monastery of Panagia Spiliotissa built in the 16th century is one of the most important religious monuments in Zagori, nestles on the left bank of Voidomatis river and is perched on a rock at the outskirts of Aristi village. The construction of the building has been the implementation of many architectural techniques of the craftsmen of the time. The monastery has been declared a historical monument. It is in perfect harmony with the environment, because some of the cells are built in such a way as to incorporate parts of the rock.

The church a single-aisle basilica with dome was internally covered by excellent technical frescoes of the 17th cent, which were not well maintained until recent years. Following their preservation by the Ministry of Culture, Aristi Mountain resort stepped in and facilitated in the cleaning of the monastery which had become a bat cave and the painting of the other communal spaces. The key of the church for many years was kept in the hotel so visitors may have the chance to visit this unique church and donate in the efforts for its preservation

A JOURNEY IN TIME

Aristi Mountain Resort + Villas guests discover and follow the sheep wool journey from past to present. The workshop takes anyone who joins on a tour of the art of wool processing.

The seminar is for both young and old. During this workshop, the participants wash the sheep wool, dry it, and lay it down. The participants have the chance to watch a professional demonstration of the techniques of creating handmade fabrics, such as knitting and weaving on the traditional loom. Finally, all the people in this workshop make a jewel with the felt technique, for which tools are not necessary!
