










California Senate Bill 1383

Property Waste Management Program

- Tools - receptacles, signage, correct waste bags for compost, recycle, and trash. Training materials.

-Departmental WM Champions – One or two Managers from each department to ensure tools are in place and up to date. Provide positive encouragement . Monitor their areas for proper sorting.

- Education & Training - Videos and slide shows to be presented at new hire orientations and periodically at Manager and departmental meetings as a refresh and update.

-Monitoring - Regular checks of main waste and individual disposal areas to ensure recycle, trash and compostable are being properly sorted, and that contamination of recycle and compostables is not occurring. Report noncompliance to Department Champions. Record information from refuse company invoice to track progress. Here at Cavallo Point the job of monitoring is handled by the Grounds and Maintenance Department managers.

INTRODUCTION TO THE INDUSTRY


Each year, the amount of waste sent to landfill increases.
